Some Important Points to Consider

First, Owners should look out for one another's properties. This can be particularly important for those who live in Red Water part-time or those who travel frequently.

Second, "Crime Watch" signs are posted at the front and back entrances of the Red Water subdivision. Signage can help deter potential criminal acts; it sends the message that residents care about their neighborhood.

Third, lighting can also serve to deter crime in the community; well-lit areas and homes are less likely to be vandalized.

Fourth, orderly and well-maintained homes and lawns also help to reduce vulnerability to crime.

Please keep an eye out for unfamiliar people or vehicles in the neighborhood but do so without profiling; awareness is key. If you don't have a neighbor or someone to look after your home while you are away, please call or text Cathi Lapp at **262-388-0870**.
